UNISON and your Teaching Assistant reps have been working tirelessly to win the best deal for all Durham TAs. This has of course been a long and difficult process, but we believe that the council have now made their final offer – and the strongest possible through negotiations.

Thanks to your dedication, your campaigning and your action, we've won a significantly better deal for all Durham TAs:

- Stopping the Council from dismissing you on 31st December 2016.
- Achieving a full review of the teaching assistant roles and involved UNISON teaching assistants at every step of the process to deliver new job descriptions.
- Developing a new grading structure which more fully reflects the roles that you carry out, which has resulted in approximately 87% of UNISON members receiving an increase in their grade.
- Securing flexibility around additional hours to capture, contractually, the hours you are working and negotiated an additional week as part of your contract.
- And for those who stand to lose pay ensuring no loss in pay for two years from implementation.

And now we've won even more concessions from the council, including:

- The establishment of a 'Teaching Assistant Career Progression Board' – with TA representation – with a priority to find solutions to eliminate any pay losses.
- Specific written guidance for Head Teachers regarding short-term cover of classes.




